



# SCHOOLS TRACTOR PULL COMPETITION

The Schools Tractor Pull is a fun event where primary schools submit a team of 20 students to pull a tractor over a distance of 40 metres as fast as they can with a rope.

Times will be recorded and the four fastest schools from the heats will then compete in the Finals (Saturday) at Primex for total prize money of \$2,000 as per distribution in the form of a donation to their school. We will work with schools to schedule heats with options available Thursday, Friday & Saturday.

**1ST PLACE - \$800**

**2ND PLACE - \$600**

**3RD PLACE - \$350**

**4TH PLACE - \$250**

In our inaugural year there is a maximum number of (12) teams (schools) that may enter and compete in 2019 with nominations & allocation before April 30th 2019.

## RULES

1. Each school must form a team of 20 students
2. Students must be year six or under
3. Shoes must be worn but no spiked shoes or rugby boots are allowed
4. Once the team is ready to pull, an air-horn will sound. The air-horn will sound again once the tractor crosses the finish line - back wheels must fully cross the finish line before time is stopped
5. The heats and final will be held on grass in the Tractor Pull Arena
6. Each school must nominate a captain/spokesperson

## HEALTH & SAFETY

It is important that everyone has read the health & safety information below.

1. The tractor pull area will be cordoned off with standards and rope
2. Only contestants, event organisers and school staff may enter the tractor pull area
3. Before entering the area to be used as the tractor pull space, please wait until the tractor has stopped moving and is ready to be pulled
4. The tractor will be switched on to pull, but will be in neutral and manned at all times in case of any trips/falls
5. If anyone does fall over during the pull, the airhorn will sound and everyone must stop pulling
6. Shoes must be worn
7. Please stay alert and be aware of the tractor's movements. It will be manned at all times
8. Each school must appoint an event manager to ensure these and the Health & Safety requirements of their school are met
9. Each school must have its own health and safety policy
10. All contestants must be present for a group health and safety briefing at the beginning of the event
