\$2000 Retooling Vouchers for the purchase of equipment (for example, tools of trade, key equipment or infrastructure) destroyed or damaged during an event. These vouchers are used for the replacement of essential equipment which assists the business in reopening or resuming operating.



\$500 Business Advisory Vouchers provide critical business support and expert advice from local accounting services, appraisal and evaluation, architectural/ interior design services, financial planning, IT services, legal services, management consulting, marketing/web development services and training and development.

These business advisory services may be useful in the recovery period when a business is considering its future operations.
